

Academic Focus Award Information

The Academic Focus program was created to encourage students to specialize in specific content areas, and reward them for their accomplishments. Each Focus Award will have academic, subject specific, and a writing requirements. Students may also be required to participate in extracurricular groups, clubs, and activities.

There are no limits to how many Focus Awards students may earn. Applications cannot be submitted until senior year and are due the 1st Friday in April. It will be the responsibility of the student to fill out the application and keep track of records and participation.

Recognition and Benefits:

- The student will receive an Enhanced Diploma in each qualifying area.
- The student will wear a designated cord for graduation in each qualifying area.
- The student will be acknowledged in the graduation program.
- The student will receive special recognition at Senior Awards Night.
- Students who complete the activities that correspond to the focus awards will be better prepared to represent Providence Hall in the Sterling Scholar program.

Application Requirements

- Student will earn a B average in **ALL** of the following courses:
 - 1 Credit: Sec Math I, Advanced Honors or Honors
 - 1 Credit: Sec Math II, Advanced Honors or Honors
 - 1 Credit: Sec Math III, Statistics, Math SL Year 1 or Math HL Year 1
 - 1 Credit: Modern Math, Math Studies, Statistics, Math SL Year 2 or Math HL Year 2 or CE Math

- Participation in **TWO** of the following activities:
 - State math contest (include note from Ms. Anderson)
 - Math tutoring (this does not include peer mentoring, get note from parent or teacher that you are helping) minimum of 15 hours
 - Job shadow an individual who uses math in their job (accountant, engineer, and etc.)
 - Write a 3-5-page paper detailing your experience and the correlation between the math they use and the math you have been taught.
 - Complete the application for Sterling Scholar with a focus in Math (include note from Mr. Olsen as proof)
 - Math project (cannot be a class assignment). *12-page IB Math waives this requirement, if turned in on time*
 - Minimum of 5 hours
 - Needs approval from both a Math teacher and the Academic Director
 - A portfolio of the process will be needed as proof of completion

- Student will write a 1 ½ to 2-page paper that includes **BOTH** of the following:
 - **Explain** how the requirements of the Math Focus has influenced their ability to THINK and COMMUNICATE.
 - **Analyze** how the requirements of the Math Focus has impacted their ACTIONS.
