



Patriot Pride Award Requirements

2nd Grade

The Patriot Pride award is designed to challenge students. These goals are centered on developing strong academic and citizenship skills within our students. Students will choose 8 goals that they would like to work on throughout the school year; 4 must be from the patriotic category and 4 from the other. These goals can be worked on in the home and at school but must be quality work or it will not be accepted. The teacher or the parent can initial each goal as it is passed off. At the end of the year if their 8 goals have been completed, the student will be recognized for their accomplishment in our end of year assembly. This sheet must be initialed and returned by **Friday, May 14th, 2021**.

Patriotic Pride (Choose 4)

1. Memorize the Preamble to the constitution
2. Clean up garbage at a park or around your house (or come up with a civic activity)
3. Memorize and sing a patriotic song
4. Choose a continent and learn 10 facts and present to the class (i.e., culture, language, food, countries)
5. Compare and contrast two states and present to the class
6. Learn more about a president and present it to the class
7. Interview someone in the community (city, school or religious), present what makes them a good citizen and how they contribute to our community.
8. Create a patriotic art project that has symbolic meaning. Share with the class why you chose that project
9. Visit a national/state park or a monument. Write a short summary on your experience
10. Learn more about your city's mayor. Make a PowerPoint to present your information

Other Goals (Choose 4)

1. Write a persuasive letter about a topic you are passionate about and turn it in to your teacher.
2. Record a book trailer trying to persuade someone to read your favorite book
3. Alphabetize all the DVD's or books in your house
4. Design a survey and poll 20 people from your community and graph the results
5. Interview someone and write a biography about that person. Share it with the class
6. Record yourself acting and presenting a fairy tale
7. Create a book report and do a diorama about that book
8. Go to the store and pick out 5 items and calculate the cost of all of the items without using a calculator. Decide how much change you would get if you gave the cashier \$20.00
9. Make a model to represent the shapes, kinds of land and bodies of water in our area
10. Research an event that has changed the planet or parts of the planet (ex. The cause of the Thistle Landslide in the 1980's and how that changed the planet.)
11. Sketch, draw or model how the shape of an object helps it function to solve a problem (Example: How does the shape of a hammer help it work?)
12. Act of service of your choice. Write a report on it for your teacher.
